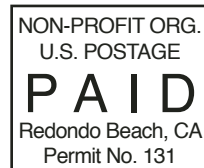

RALPH'S REWARDS CARD**

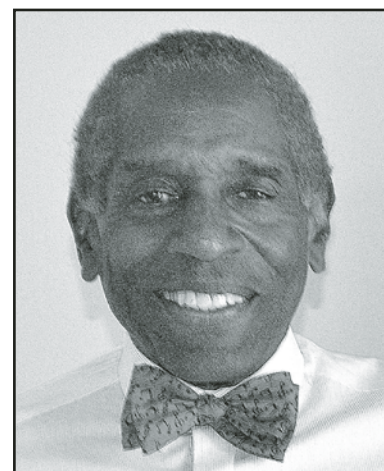

Bob was born in Los Angeles in 1947 and attended 42nd Street Elementary, Audubon Junior High, and Dorsey High Schools. He enjoyed school (luckily, since both his parents were teachers) and enthusiastically participated in music,

athletics, and student government, as well as academics. He began his music studies in the USC Preparatory School of Music with piano in 1954 and clarinet in 1958. During college, while pursuing chemistry as a major, he began playing contrabass and electric bass.

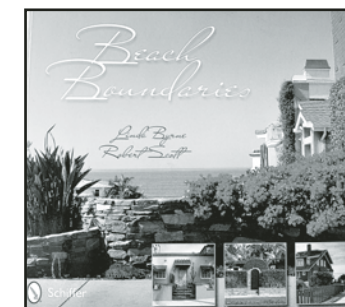
After college graduation, in the Viet Nam era, Bob joined the 249th Signal Battalion of the California National Guard, where he served as a communications specialist and section chief. While in basic training at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, Bob was awarded the "American Spirit Honor Medal" as the top trainee in the battalion. During his six years of monthly weekend drills and yearly summer camps for the

military, he began his initial career teaching high school chemistry in 1973.

During 34 years of teaching, Bob completed graduate studies in Chemistry and Environmental Science, and earned a Certificate in Air Quality Management. He is retired from teaching and now works as a consultant in the Air Pollution field, and is an adjunct lecturer in Air Pollution Control Technologies at Loyola Marymount University.

Bob has lived in the South Bay since 1974 and has enjoyed participating in the Beach Cities Symphony's string bass section since 2004. Our audience enjoyed his narration of *Peter and the Wolf* at the Symphony's January, 2014, concert.

In his spare time, Bob enjoys playing jazz and Hawaiian music and enjoys gardening and photography. He and one of his neighbors produced a lovely book, *Beach Boundaries*, which gives a visual tour of the unique entryways and gardens of some of the South Bay beaches' beautiful homes. He continues to be an avid surfer, with 53+ years of experience.
