CARLOS GARDELS — Piano soloist

Carlos Gardels has been a student of the piano since the age of seven. Born in Los Angeles, he made his concerto debut at age fifteen as soloist in the Rachmaninoff Third Piano Concerto under the direction of Robert Allen Gross in the Wilshire Ebell Theatre, and he has since gone on to appear at numerous festivals and venues across the country. He has received awards from the national Society of Arts and Letters competition and won scholarships from the Young Musicians Foundation (YMF).



Mr. Gardels holds a Bachelor's degree from the Manhattan School of Music and a Master's degree from Indiana University. He is also an esteemed and versatile teacher. In January, 2014, he was a visiting faculty member at the FaceArt International School of Shanghai, China, and appeared in television and radio interviews. Additionally, he has served on the faculties of Indiana University's pre-college department and the California Academy of Music. He currently resides in Los Angeles and maintains a private studio of awardwinning pupils.



Jerome Kessler is a versatile musician who is active on the West Coast on the concert stage and in commercial music venues. He is the principal cellist of the Los Angeles Cello Quartet and is the founder and conductor of the cello octet *I Cellisti*. He appears widely as a soloist in chamber music and symphonic events and is prominent in the orchestras of Los Angeles television and motion picture studios. Mr. Kessler has performed under Pierre Boulez, and toured and recorded with Frank Zappa. He is

well-known to audiences and has concertized across the United States. He has recorded as soloist or conductor for Everest, Orion, Cambria, and Arnaeus Records. He is a charter member of the American Symphony Orchestra under Leopold Stokowski, and he was a founding director of the Los Angeles



at numerous universities. This is Mr. Kessler's second appearance as soloist with the Beach Cities Symphony; his first appearance was in January, 2012, performing Elgar's Cello Concerto in E minor.

Rhondda Dayton is principal flute of the Beach Cities Symphony, Moorpark Symphony, Westchester Chamber Orchestra, and Footworks Ballet Orchestra. Ms. Dayton has been a featured soloist with the Hour of Power, Ventura Civic, California Lutheran

University, Moorpark, Royal Oaks, Beach Cities, and Long Beach College Symphony Orchestras. She was also principal flute for the internationally televised Hour of Power Orchestra at the Crystal Cathedral for 11 years. Ms. Dayton has performed at National Flute Association conventions with the Professional Flute Choir, National Flute Choir, Pipe Dream Flutes & Friends, and the Wind Advisory Wind Quintet. Her recording credits include ten National Flute Choir CDs; Season of Joy, Part 2; Vivaldi Flute Concertos featuring David Shostar; and Celine Dion's Grammy© award-winning These are Special Times (vocals). She performed on European tours with the Santa Monica Chamber Orchestra, International Haydn Festival Orchestra (principal), and on a national tour with the Global Community Orchestra (principal) as they honored the military. Ms. Dayton is founder and artistic director of the ensemble Pipe Dreams Flutes & Friends, which performed a program of commissioned works for the 2013 National Flute Association in New Orleans. Ms. Dayton performed Chabrier's España in her last appearance as soloist with the Beach Cities Symphony in March, 2010.
