Welcome to the 70th Season of The Beach Cities Symphony Featuring Four New Conductors

Marsee Auditorium at El Camino College

The Beach Cities Symphony's first rehearsals began in 1949 with less than 25 instrumentalists,

and in the early 1950s the orchestra performed at Redondo Beach High School's old auditorium. After Mira Costa High School came into being, our performances took place in their new auditorium. The orchestra has now been rehearsing in the

Redondo Union High School for many years. In 1968, our concerts moved to the newly-built Marsee Auditorium and have been performed there ever since. In the 1960s, under the direction of then Music Director and Conductor

Louis J. Palange, the orchestra performed at the Dorothy Chandler Pavilion. The orchestra has had several conductors in these past 69 years; Louis J. Palange and Barry Brisk, led the orchestra for the longest times by far. For our 70th season,

we are featuring a new conductor for each of our four concerts. One of these four will be the conductor for our 71st season.

of his sustained international acclaim, the U.S. government acknowledged his "extraordinary ability in the arts." He is the composer of the city anthem of his native Plovdiv, Bulgaria. This is his third concerto appearance with our orchestra.

Paul Piazza is a native of Southern California with a full schedule as a conductor, vocalist, trumpeter, and music educator. He earned his Bachelor of Music degree

from the Frost School of Music at the University of Miami. He has shared the stage with some of the world's greatest musical artists, including conductor Michael Tilson Thomas, pianist Jeremy Denk, and soprano Laura Aiken. Mr. Piazza has guest conducted prestigious ensembles including the Riverside Philharmonic and the Grammynominated Diamond Bar High School Symphony Orchestra. He currently holds the positions of Music Director with the Westlake Village Symphony and Assistant Conductor with the Riverside Philharmonic.

California native **Erin Wood**'s portrayals of Verdi and Wagner heroines have received praise for her "soaring soprano" and "volcanic outpouring of sound." For The Lyric Opera of Chicago, Ms. Wood has portrayed Sieglinda in *Die Walküre*, Lisa in Queen of Spades, Gutrune/Third Norn in *Götter-dämmerung* as well as nine other roles since her tenure with their Ryan Opera Center. She has been seen as Amelia in *Un Ballo*

in Maschera with the San Francisco Opera and Opera Colorado, and proudly joined the roster of the Metropolitan Opera for Die Walküre. Locally, Ms. Wood sings weekly on Hour of Power. She is an alumna of UCLA and is a member of the voice faculty at El Camino College.

Dean Anderson has actively engaged communities near and far with his passion for music. He recently completed his seventh season as the Music Director and Artis-

tic Director for the Dana Point Symphony. He continually strives to champion a diverse blend of repertoire, ranging from the beloved works of Beethoven and Brahms, to newly commissioned works by local and international composers. His international engagements include concerts with professional orchestras in Brazil, Argentina, Hong Kong, Thailand, and Viet Nam. Mr. Anderson's performances include major ballet works and numerous operas. He was the first American citizen to conduct the Ho Chi Minh city Ballet Orchestra in 2011.

Roberto Cani is acclaimed throughout the music world as not just a performer, but an "artiste," and has been hailed by critics as "a violinist of high caliber following a great Italian tradition of the virtuoso Paganini." In addition to his native Italy, Roberto Cani concertizes throughout the United States as well as Germany, Belgium, Austria, Spain,



Russia, Croatia, Poland, Serbia, France, Taiwan, Japan, and South Africa. He is a frequent soloist with orchestras and has performed, most notably, with the Moscow Philharmonic, La Scala Orchestra, RAI Symphony (Italy), Belgrade Orchestra, Zagreb Orchestra, and Missouri Chamber Orchestra.


